BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Nomination Guidelines

The British Association of Dermatologists (BAD) is a charity whose objectives are the practice, teaching, training, and research of Dermatology. Founded 102 years ago, the BAD strives to improve skin health for all people by demonstrating the principles of equality, fairness, care, and collaboration.

The British Association of Dermatologists aims to recognise and celebrate individuals who have made outstanding contributions within the field of dermatological care. The BAD Executive Committee considers recommendations for individuals nominated by the BAD membership for one of our Awards.

BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year

Established in 2017, the BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Award has been designed to celebrate and recognise a clinical dermatologist who has made a real difference in their local department by going above and beyond. Through their own personal leadership and contribution, they may have raised the profile of dermatology, supported colleagues or made improvements to local services.

The successful nominee will receive:

- The BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Award

The BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Award and scroll will be presented to the successful nominee at the 103rd BAD Annual General Meeting in Liverpool on **Tuesday 27th June 2023**.

Nominations

This award is open to BAD members of good standing. Nominations are invited from any BAD Member. Please send a citation (500 words maximum) in support of your nomination by completing the awards nomination form and returning it to: admin@bad.org.uk by **17:00 on Monday 3rd April 2023**.

Previous recipients of the BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Award are not eligible to be nominated and self-nominations are not accepted.

Nominations are accepted for both the Sir Archibald Gray Medal and the BAD Dermatology Clinician of the Year Awards in the same round of awards, however if successful in both, the nominee would only be permitted to accept one award - the Sir Archibald Gray Medal.

Awards Criteria

Please consider the following points which could demonstrate the *impact the individual has had locally:

- Evidence of how the clinician has raised the profile of dermatology.
- Evidence of the impact and difference this individual has made to the experience of working in the department, how the individual has shaped or expanded services or improved the quality of care that has been delivered to patients.
- Evidence of mentorship, an exceptional teacher and of being a consistent role model or leader to others.

*Please note that there is not an expectation or requirement that all of these elements have been achieved or demonstrated by the nominee. Each citation will have its own unique features that the Executive Committee will consider, and the above list serves only as a guide.
